Subject: Member Officer Task and Finish Group – Parking Management Strategy

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-
 - advise the Forum on the Terms of Reference for the Member/Officer Task and Finish Group set up to review the Parking Management Strategy.

2. Recommendation(s)

- 2.1. The Forum is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):-
 - (1) that the proposed Terms of Reference agreed by the Member/Officer Task and Finish Group to review parking arrangements be noted.

3. Background

- 3.1. A report to the Council's Executive Committee of 23 February 2011 recommended the establishment of a Member/Officer Task and Finish Group to review the current car parking arrangements throughout the council area.
- 3.2. This recommendation was approved by the Executive Committee and included the elected member representation on the group.
- 3.3 The group met on 16 March 2011 and appointed a Chair (Councillor Graham Scott) and agreed Terms of Reference. The group has continued to meet on a regular basis.
- 3.4. The Executive Committee report advised that the Group would establish its own Terms of Reference and report them to this Forum. A copy of the Terms of Reference is attached (see Appendix 1). These have been agreed by the Member/Officer Task and Finish Group.

	 Compare South Lanarkshire Council's policy and practices with other similar authorities.
	 Consider the financial aspect of current arrangements.
	 Consider the appropriateness of current management arrangements across South Lanarkshire.
	 Consider current enforcement capacity.
	 Consider arrangements for enforcement of blue badges (display issues).
