International Children's Games

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-
 - inform members of the activities that are impacting on children and young people as a result of the International Children's Games(ICG).

2. Recommendation(s)

- 2.1. The Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):-
 - (1) that the joint programme of activities between South Lanarkshire Education Resources and North Lanarkshire Learning and Leisure Services outlined in Appendix 1 be noted; and
 - (2) that the range of South Lanarkshire activities taken forward by schools and youth learning, with support from South Lanarkshire Leisure to increase the involvement of young people in ICG related events highlighted in Appendix 2 on an area basis be noted.

3. Background

- 3.1. Following a successful joint bid by North and South Lanarkshire Councils to bring the ICG to Scotland for the first time, up to 1,500 competitors aged 12 to 15 years, along with coaches, administrators and delegates from more than 70 countries will travel to Lanarkshire for the International Olympic Committee recognised event in August 2011.
- 3.2. The 2011 Games provides an opportunity for Lanarkshire to showcase its strengths, and the talents of young people to a global audience and to demonstrate the power of sport to change lives for the better, improve communities and foster ambitions for a brighter future.

4. Current Position

4.1. Education Resources (SLC) and Learning and Leisure Services (NLC) have jointly planned and organised a number of learning activities for children and young people in recognition of the ICG (Appendix 1). These have been linked to curricular activities and are intended to provide all pupils within Lanarkshire with an opportunity to be involved in some way with this prestigious event. The activities span a broad range of curricular areas, are inter-disciplinary in format, and designed to embrace the principles of Curriculum for Excellence.

- 4.2. As a result of the high profile given to the event by Education Resources and through the enthusiasm of staff and partners a number of South Lanarkshire projects have emerged including school based activities and youth learning related events. (Appendix 2) These have encouraged creativity and health promotion in our children and young people and have enabled them to develop and enhance their skills. Examples of this:
 - The Tile Project in Clydesdale
 - The Cultural Kinetics Fashion Project
 - The Mural at the underpass in Uddingston
 - The work of the Sports Ambassadors in Secondary Schools
 - The creation of Gaelic bookmarks and signage by Mount Cameron Primary and Calderglen High
 - The work with the Scots Author Matthew Fitt and Holy Cross High School to create a guide to Scots Language for athletes.

5. Impact and Benefit

5.1. The ICG are providing an opportunity for young people to take part in a range of sports with the associated benefits that comes from this in terms of improving health, boosting confidence and motivating young people to take part in the biggest international event held in Lanarkshire.

South Lanarkshire Council: Education Resources International Children's Games

Joint Activities: NLC and SLC

1. Art and Design Competition – Status: Completed

- The international desktop calendar has been distributed
- The Christmas card has been distributed
- The large education calendar for schools across Lanarkshire are being distributed
- The Awards ceremony took place at Ravenscraig Sports Facility on 1 April with performances from St Aloysius Primary (Choir), Cathkin High School (Gymnastics), Airdrie Academy (Dance) and Calderglen High School (Saxophone Quartet). This was a resounding success with a large number of VIPs, parents and pupils in attendance.
- It is hoped that winning entries will be displayed at the Watersports centre in Strathclyde Park during the Games but this has yet to be confirmed.

2. The International Children's Games Resource Pack – Status: Completed

- Now live on Glow and can be accessed by all schools in Lanarkshire.
- In February there were 3000 visits to the Glow group and almost 10000 since the group went live. This figure is expected to increase as schools plan to focus their work on ICG activities in the summer term.

3. Twinning – Status: ongoing

Twinning Link with Igor Topole's school in Slovenia.

• Igor plans to visit Lanarkshire on 1 June as part of his official duties and will visit St John the Baptist Primary School on 6 June to move this forward. Further links have been made with Noble Primary School.

5. ICG flag relay project – Status: ongoing

- A Lanarkshire ICG banner originally a flag will be passed between all the schools in Lanarkshire. This will be done using active travel where possible and in areas where there is a significant distance between schools, the ICG bus can be used. As the flag passes through, each school will be given a pack of information with ICG facts, merchandise and details of ICG activities available to participate in locally.
- Plans for this are moving forward and the banner is now in transit.

6. Pan Lanarkshire Games – Status: ongoing

• A joint North/South event for S1/S2 pupils will take place on 16 June in the John Cumming Stadium, Carluke.

7. Scots Language Project – Status: Almost completed

- **Gaelic** : Mount Cameron Primary have designed Gaelic Bookmarks and Calderglen High School have prepared signage in Gaelic for the event.
- **Messages and Ginger**: Matthew Fitt, Scots Author, has worked with both Holy Cross High School and Caldervale High School to produce a glossary for the athletes.

8. Library Project - Reading Relay- Status: Just beginning

- Will take the form of a map of Lanarkshire with 9 stations/stops which link to the venues hosting the events. General working title of "Read Around Lanarkshire"
- The Reading Relay will run from May until end September.
- Official launch planned for the 31st of May
- All Schools in South Lanarkshire and North Lanarkshire are being invited to register their pupils for the Reading Relay.
- Estimated numbers are 2,000 pupils to complete from schools across Lanarkshire.
- All libraries across North and South Lanarkshire are taking part
- Children in this age range can join during the summer holidays in any library if they are not taking part through their school.
- There will be 9 reading stops corresponding to the venues hosting an event across Lanarkshire
- 3 prizes (bronze- message bug, silver pedometer and gold sports water bottle) will be given to children throughout the Reading Relay
- Some prizes at the end for a prize draw.
- There will be posters and bookmarks in the schools and libraries/leisure centres to promote the programme

9. Core Connex Project – Status: Preparation stages

• This project proposes to give young people (from North and South Lanarkshire) not directly involved in the Games the opportunity to play a part in the experience and also to develop skills and qualifications that will contribute to their personal and social development.

The project will provide a group of young people with the opportunity to create a documentary about the journey of young people competing in the Games; filming young people in training in preparation for the games, following their progress during the games and capturing their thoughts and feelings when the games are finished.

Starting in July 2011, the group will spend the first month creating a storyboard of their film, learning basic camera and sound skills, and begin filming training sessions. The first week in August, when the Games are being held, will be an intensive week of filming for the group. Following this the group will spend several months interviewing participants, learning editing skills, producing the final DVD and working towards their Youth Achievement Award.

At the end of the programme young people will be offered the opportunity to continue to volunteer as a 'film crew' with Core Connex and work towards their Digital Cre8or qualification.

South Lanarkshire Projects

1. Promoting ICG through Secondary Departments- Status: ongoing

• Sports Ambassadors in Secondaries are working with young people in primaries to promote the games through talks and sports activities. Holy Cross High School Gold Ambassadors have visited all of their associated primaries and engaged with other primaries in the area to help with Sports activities.

2. Cultural Kinetics project – Status: Complete

A fashion show and private view of exhibition took place on Tuesday 18th January 2011 at the National Museum of Rural Life.

Schools involved:

Rutherglen High - Pupils made a piece of headwear based on their chosen country's flag. In addition to this they are all printed their own t-shirt using elements of the flag. Countries focused on are Ireland, USA, UK, Japan, Brazil, Mexico & Monaco.

Uddingston Grammar – Pupils designed and created 'Sculptural Medals' incorporating elements of both their chosen 'game' and 'Scottish' reference e.g. Badminton/Highland Cow, Track and Field/Paulo Nutini, Sailing/Tunnocks.

Lesmahagow High – Pupils are designed and maked nuno felted and embroidered scarfs, using football as the source of inspiration.

Calderglen & Sanderson High – created three dimensional body adornments. Pupils have taken sports objects /clothing, buildings and transformed this into unique structures.

3. Murray Primary School – Awards for All funded project- Status: Complete

Every child from nursery - P7 was involved with Artist Deborah Campbell on creating a textile banner. A display around this including photos, examples of the work in progress, original designs and pieces of writing from the children was made promoting a lifelong interest in sporting and cultural activities.

The children were given sporting taster sessions over a 6 week period ending in May. The Active Schools Co-ordinator provided a leaflet which gave the children and their families community links in relation to age appropriate clubs in EK to take forward any sporting activity that the children would like to take up.

The school's media club have been involved in taking pictures of both of the above and are working on creating articles, newspaper reports, blogs, video footage etc to promote the above work.

4. Tile Project in the Clydesdale Area - Status: ongoing

A local artist has been working with local primaries in Clydesdale to create a tiled mural. The unveiling will take place on 21 June.

5. Painting of the Underpass in Uddingston – Status: ongoing

Muiredge and St John the Baptist Primaries are involved in a joint project to paint the underpass next to the schools. The schools are working with graphic artists and a local councillor to create a mural with an ICG theme

6. Schools' Projects – Status: ongoing

All schools were invited to involve children and young people in school events. A list of these activities are attached with this appendix.
