Subject:	SOCITM Annual Survey of Local Authority Websites
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1. Purpose of Report

1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-

- ♦ Provide an overview of the findings of SOCITM's Better Connected annual survey of local authority websites.

2. Recommendation(s)

2.1. The Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):-

- (1) that improvement on the website rankings whilst maintaining transactional status is noted
- (2) that progression of an action plan to address the issues and any improvements involving all Resources is noted
- (3) that it be noted that the above will be included in the Modernising Government 2010/11 Section Plan.

3. Background

3.1. This was the twelfth annual survey carried out by SOCITM of all local authority websites. In total 479 websites were examined. A team of reviewers carried out a structured survey with 120 questions for local authority websites, followed by 5 shorter surveys on specific topics. The evidence from these informs the ranking.

3.2. This year they have used the new ranking system (1 to 4 stars). The 4 star ranking introduced in 2010 is based on two elements:

- ♦ how many of the Better Connected essential criteria (see below) have been met by the website to the specified performance standard
- ♦ the reviewer's overall score for the website's quality, which can be 1(poor), 2(adequate), 2(satisfactory) or 3(very good).

- 3.3. South Lanarkshire Council's website maintained the 'Transactional' status awarded in 2009 Better Connected survey.

4. Survey Findings

- 4.1. Seven Scottish Unitary Authorities, including South Lanarkshire were ranked as 3 star. No Scottish authorities were rated as 4 star.

◆ 3 star	7
◆ 2 star	15
◆ 1 star	10

- 4.2. The list of 3 star Councils is listed below and shows South Lanarkshire Council in second place in relation to most content questions answered. Of those that are 3 star sites, only 5 have achieved 5 of the 9 criteria.

- ◆ Participation (how well councils engage with their local community)
- ◆ E-mail response, rated very good (only 20 councils achieved this)
