South Lanarkshire – Domestic Abuse Perpetrator Pilot (SL-DAPP)

#### 2. Project summary

Tell us about your project, what you planned to do and what you spent the money on.

The project is specifically designed to challenge perpetrators of domestic violence and to examine what supports can be offered.

The following is a brief overview of the pilot undertaken:

- Joint Social Work/Police visits to domestic abuse perpetrators whilst in Police custody. Interviews are undertaken by one Social Worker and one Police Officer, another Police Officer is also available to ensure appropriate risk measures are in place.
- Sunday visits to perpetrators whilst in custody within all South Lanarkshire Police cells. Not all perpetrators are interviewed, this is dependent on the number of incidents over the weekend and the location of police station.
- Offer a range of custodial alternatives, through the following:
  - Bail Supervision dependant on severity of the incident
  - Alcohol Misuse Work leaflet information
  - Substance Misuse Work leaflet information
  - Couple Counselling leaflet information
  - Family Mediation leaflet information
  - Mental Health Referrals as appropriate
  - Diversion through a combination of above
- Money will be spent predominately on worker salaries, with additional costs meeting admin, media and associated resources.
- Joint message was to highlight the impact of Domestic Abuse on partners and children.

The main reason why the men are selected for interview is due to severity of offence. On analysis of the offences the highest was breach of the peace, followed by assault and then persistent versus derogatory verbal abuse.

There is a wide range of issues being identified at the interview (table 2). The main issues being identified are alcohol, relationship issues and family disputes. There are still a high number (8) who deny any responsibility.

In response to the issues raised, they are also sign posted to a wide range of services. The main services the person were sign posted to were SLC substance misuse team, family mediation and Is This You (table 3).
