### 2 Minutes of Previous Meeting

The minutes of the meeting of the Cambuslang and Rutherglen Area Committee held on 24 May 2011 were submitted for approval as a correct record.

### 3 Area Profile 2011 - Cambuslang and Rutherglen

A report dated 1 August 2011 by the Executive Director (Enterprise Resources) was submitted on key indicators of conditions in the Cambuslang and Rutherglen Area Committee area. The Central Research Unit within Corporate Resources maintained a website allowing access to a wide range of information at a datazone level. Datazones were neighbourhoods of around 750 people, produced by the Scottish Government, which allowed data to be analysed and information to be reported on at approximations to a Council ward and Area Committee area basis.

Information was provided on:

- population projections for the area which indicated that the population was expected to continue to rise more rapidly than in South Lanarkshire as a whole with a significant increase in the numbers aged 80 years and over
- employment forecasts which indicated that employment would rise over the next 5 years by 0.2%
- the number of people claiming Job Seekers Allowance in June 2011, which was 1,958, giving a claimant rate of 5.1%
- percentage of children in families out of work receiving Child Tax Credit
- percentage of children in families receiving Child Tax Credit
- claimant rate for health related benefits and comparative illness statistics
- percentage of school leavers not moving into positive destinations
- percentage of pensioners claiming the guarantee element of Pension Credit
- all crimes and offences (excluding motoring offences)

The Committee decided: that the report be noted.

The representatives from Strathclyde Police gave a presentation on:-

- changes to the Divisional structure and the benefits for the Cambuslang and Rutherglen area
- the "Usual Suspects" knife crime initiative
- performance and activity during 2010/2011 which highlighted that there was a continued reduction in recorded crimes and a detection rate of 67.1% in violent crime
- activity undertaken in the course of the year and the proactive approach being adopted to move people away from criminality
- current initiatives and activities including "Move the Goalposts" and "Operation Cargo" which targeted known drinking hotspots

Chief Superintendent Gall and Chief Inspector Walker, having responded to members' questions, were thanked for their informative presentation.
