2 Minutes of Previous Meeting

3 Regeneration Services Activity in the Hamilton Area Committee Area

A report dated 14 March 2011 by the Executive Director (Enterprise Resources) was submitted providing an update on activity being undertaken by Regeneration Services with specific reference to activity within the Hamilton Area Committee area.

Details of the activity being undertaken by the 4 teams which made up the Service were provided as follows:-

Community Regeneration and Rural Development

- programme of activity, funded through the Fairer Scotland Fund, to tackle poverty in South Lanarkshire's most disadvantaged communities
- outcomes from the Changing Places community involvement projects based in Blantyre/ Hamilton and Larkhall
- a range of initiatives aimed at increasing tourism in the area

Regeneration and Inclusion

- Routes to Inclusion
- Range of programmes operating within the area including Future Jobs Fund, Routes to Work South, Connect 2, Rebuilding Opportunities and Youth Jobs Fund
- Community and Voluntary Sector support and role played by the new, single voluntary sector interface, Voluntary Action South Lanarkshire (VASLAN)

Business Support and Property Information

- role played in the Council's response to the economic downturn including working with the Business Gateway Programme
- promotion of business support initiatives such as the West of Scotland Loan Fund, Lanarkshire Sustainable Business Programme, Lanarkshire Property Advice Service and Lanarkshire Business Training Support
- promotion of the Small Business Rates Relief Scheme to ensure maximum uptake
- hosting targeted events such as Meet the Buyer and Lanarkshire Business Excellence Awards
- 91 leases concluded in the Hamilton Area Committee area between April 2010 and February 2011 with a value of £1,630,219

Property Development

- support for partners with the promotion and implementation of projects designed to enhance the attractiveness of the area as a place to work, live and do business including the following projects:-
 - Peacock Cross Wellhall Road Link Road
 - Hamilton Towers project
 - the work of the Hamilton Marketing Group
 - Hillhouse Industrial Estate construction of the new business space
 - Blackswell Lane site which had been sold to McCarthy and Stone for a development of 64 retirement flats
 - Hamilton Community Growth Area

5 South Lanarkshire Leisure and Culture Update

The General Manager of South Lanarkshire Leisure and Culture provided an introduction to and showed a promotional DVD which profiled the range of leisure and sporting facilities on offer within the area. At the conclusion of the DVD, the General Manager advised:-

- of the formation of South Lanarkshire Leisure and Culture (SLLC) on 1 October 2010, which had resulted from the expansion of South Lanarkshire Leisure to include South Lanarkshire Council's community and town halls, museums, country parks, arts development, library services and Active IT learning centres
- that SLLC was the second largest integrated sports and cultural organisation in Scotland
- that the initial challenge of integration with minimal service disruption had been achieved as a result of partnership working between South Lanarkshire Leisure and South Lanarkshire Council
- that significant funding had been made available from South Lanarkshire Council's Capital Programme to upgrade community halls, libraries and sports facilities
