2. Project summary

Tell us about your project, what you planned to do and what you spent the money on.

The Project provides a holistic advice service for prisoners' families in Lanarkshire delivered through HMP Addiewell, nine CABx and their outreach facilities and home visits where appropriate.

The key areas of the service we planned to provide are:

- Benefits initial check/ income maximization; benefit application and appeals
- Housing ensuring security of tenure;
- Specialist services e.g. money advice, employment, in –court and kinship care
- Financial Education + links to Credit Unions
- Links to community services and support

Phase 1 July – December 2009

Recruitment and induction of Project Co-ordinator; gathering research and baseline data; establishing key relationships; agreeing operational delivery across the CABx network in Lanarkshire. During this time offering a low level service though HMP Addiewell Link Centre

Phase 2 January – June 2010

Formal launch of the Project; pilot service in Hamilton Sheriff Court; establish an Advisory Group to provide strategic steer; promotion of service through key partners; negotiate referral protocols with key partners; maintain an appropriate level of service in HMP Addiewell

3. Your outcomes

Briefly describe what difference your project made by listing its outcomes (the difference your project made to the people who used it)

Four strategic outcomes were agreed with LCJA:

- Statutory and Voluntary Organisations working in criminal justice field and Lanarkshire CABx will understand each others' roles and responsibilities and the services they provide and referral protocols will be in place CAB is now an established service within HMP Addiewell Link Centre with clear understanding among prison staff and other agencies of the specific service we offer and its value. Similar understanding is being developed within Hamilton Sheriff Court police, Solicitors Faculty and court administration staff. Building relationships with key voluntary organisations e.g. Families Outside and Circle Scotland
- Prisoners and their families will have a greater awareness of CAB services and how to
 access the service at HMP Addiewell and in their local community service is promoted
 in a targeted way and beginning to reach prisoners families through HMP Addiewell and
 Hamilton Sheriff Court and local solicitors evidenced through steady rise in referrals.
- Number of Prisoners' families in the target group will have received a service and experience more stability in their lives - NB Target group initially identified as 'revolving door prisoners' - phase 1 of project will help to identify priority group(s) and realistic targets
 - Data collected during phase 1 and early phase 2 indicates that reaching families through HMP Addiewell will take time. The majority of contacts are single men. However as the service has become more established contact with families has increased and this is encouraging. At present there are no criteria for access to the service other than 'prisoners' families' while we establish who we are dealing with and identify their needs. See attached summary of contacts and enquiries
- LCJA and CABX have an increased understanding of prisoners' families needs and the issues affecting them, evidenced by social policy, statistical and client profile information
