2 Minutes of Previous Meeting

The minutes of the meeting of the Clydesdale Area Committee held on 29 November 2016 were submitted for approval as a correct record.

The Committee decided: that the minutes be approved as a correct record.

3 Community Learning and Home School Partnership Service

A presentation by D Jenkins, Senior Community Learning and Home School Partnership Worker, Education Resources was given providing an update on the comprehensive range of adult, family and community based learning opportunities available within the Clydesdale area.

The Community Learning and Home School Partnership (CLHSP) operated 4 area teams across South Lanarkshire. Those teams, in partnership with a wide range of establishments and organisations within their localities, worked to maximise the impact of community learning provision.

The CLHSP had identified the following 6 key priority areas of work:-

- adult learning
- family learning
- ♦ English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)
- ♦ Adult Literacy and Numeracy (ALN)
- ♦ volunteering
- strengthening communities

Each team had produced a Locality Review Report which highlighted the work carried out during 2015/2016. The Review Report for Clydesdale and Larkhall, which had been circulated to members, identified the following key outcomes:-

- ♦ 1,191 adults had participated in learning programmes
- ♦ 74 adults had received nationally recognised awards
- ♦ 59 family learning programmes had been delivered
- ◆ 1,099 young people had participated in learning programmes
- ♦ 21 adults had improved their English through ESOL provision
- ♦ 261 volunteers had accessed training and support to directly impact on CLHSP provision
- volunteers had contributed 11,640 hours to areas of work within their local community

Information was also provided on the following Service-wide developments:-

- Adult Learners' Week 2014
- ♦ Family Man Fun Day 2015
- ♦ International Women's Day 2016
- contribution of volunteers in complementing the work of the CLHSP

The Senior Community Learning and Home School Partnership Worker, having responded to members' questions, was thanked for her informative presentation.

The Committee decided:

- (1) that the Community Learning and Home School Partnership Service 2015/2016 Locality Review Report for Clydesdale and Larkhall be noted; and
- (2) that the positive impact that the Community Learning and Home School Partnership Service had made on local communities be noted.

4 Education Scotland Report - Bent Primary School, Lesmahagow

A report dated 7 February 2017 by the Executive Director (Education Resources) was submitted on the outcome of the inspection of Bent Primary School, Lesmahagow made by Education Scotland.

The inspection had taken place in May 2016 as part of a national sample of primary education and the inspection letter reporting on the findings had been published on 23 August 2016.

A number of particular strengths of the school had been highlighted in the inspection letter. The areas for improvement, agreed with the school and education authority, had been incorporated into the school's improvement plan and parents would be informed of progress in overtaking the points for action. Education Scotland had intimated that they would make no further visits in connection with this inspection.

D Hinshelwood, Support Services Manager and C Fleming, Headteacher spoke on key aspects of the report and responded to members' questions.

The Committee decided: that the report be noted.

5 Community Grant Applications
