Subject: Examination Results (post appeal) 2010

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-
 - inform the Education Resources Committee of the 2010 examination results.

2. Recommendation(s)

- 2.1. The Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):-
 - (1) that the information regarding examination results for 2010 post appeal be noted; and
 - (2) that the use made of the examination results data by schools, Head of Education, Head Teachers and Quality Link Officers as part of the Resources overall approach to continuous improvement is noted.

3. Background

- 3.1. The Scottish Government has released the post-appeals data for the 2010 examination results (Standard Tables and Charts STACS) in electronic format. The data provided is a comprehensive breakdown of results and serves as a useful tool for Head Teachers to discuss examination results with subject departments. Information is also available at authority level.
- 3.2. Education Resources has produced an analysis of the examination results for the Council as a whole and for each secondary school in South Lanarkshire. The report has been produced by an external consultant who has been heavily involved in the development of STACS.
- 3.3. All secondary school Head Teachers have access to the STACS data (web-based) and also the South Lanarkshire Council analysis.
- 3.4. This report presents a summary of the performance of pupils in South Lanarkshire Council's schools for consideration by the Education Resources Committee (Appendix 1).
- 3.5. The information is presented as a summary of the performance of pupils in SQA examinations on a whole authority basis compared with the same information for schools nationally and for South Lanarkshire Council's Family Benchmarking Group Tables 1-9.

3.6. The pre-appeal and post-appeal data for 2010 is summarised in the table below.

4. Performance of girls and boys in examinations

- 4.1. The performance of girls in S4 examinations in South Lanarkshire is better than boys. 42% of girls achieved 5 or more awards at level 5 compared with 30% of boys. There was an increase in the performance of girls in South Lanarkshire in 2010. The performance of boys remains consistent with the previous session. Attainment of both boys and girls remains above that of the average of the comparator authorities.
- 4.2. The performance of girls in S5 examinations is also ahead of boys. 13% of girls achieved 5 or more awards at level 6 compared with 10% of boys. 28% of girls achieved 3 or more awards at level 6 compared with 21% of boys. This statistic is in line with the national position. Attainment for both boys and girls in the measures 1 or more, 3 or more and 5 or more awards at Level 6 is above the comparator average.
- 4.3. The performance of girls in S6 examinations is also ahead of boys. 25% of girls achieved 5 or more awards at level 6 by the end of S6 compared with 20% of boys. Similarly, 37% of girls achieved 3 or more awards at level 6 compared with 30% of boys. This statistic is again similar to the national position. The performance of boys and girls in S6 in South Lanarkshire is above the comparator authority average in the measures 3 or more and 5 or more awards at level 6.

5. Progression into Higher – General Information

- 5.1. A key factor in achieving success at Higher level is providing appropriate advice to pupils based on their attainment level at Standard Grade or Intermediate level 2.
- 5.2. Although there will be subject differences, approximately 91% of those attaining a Standard Grade 1 in S4 and 63% of those attaining Standard Grade 2 in S4 will convert to a Higher pass in S5.
- 5.3. The average success rate for students resitting Higher following an unsuccessful attempt in S5 is 62%.
- 5.4. The average success rate for students resitting Higher to improve the grade is 45%.
- 5.5. The average success rate for students sitting the Higher in S6 but who did not attempt any level of award in the corresponding course in S5 is 72%.
- 5.6. The average success rate of students attempting Higher English after achieving a Standard Grade 3 in S4 is 36%.

5.7. The average success rate of students attempting Higher Mathematics after achieving Standard Grade 3 in S4 is 31%.


















