2 Minutes of Previous Meeting

3 HMle Follow-through Report - St Charles' Primary School, Cambuslang

A report dated 20 May 2009 by the Executive Director (Education Resources) was submitted on the outcome of the follow-through inspection of St Charles' Primary School, Cambuslang undertaken by Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education (HMIe) in February 2009.

The initial inspection of the school had taken place in March 2007 and the report published in June 2007 had identified 7 main points for action. An action plan had been put in place to ensure that the areas highlighted in the report were addressed. In March 2008, an interim follow-through visit was undertaken with a further inspection of the school being made in February of this year. The follow-through report, published on 19 May 2009, had concluded that there was clear evidence of significant improvement and that the school was performing much better overall. On that basis, it was indicated that HMle would make no further visits in connection with the inspection undertaken in March 2007.

The Head of Education (Cambuslang and Rutherglen Area) and Headteacher spoke on key aspects of the report and responded to members' questions.

Congratulations were extended to the Headteacher and her staff on the progress achieved within the school in the period since the publication of the initial inspection report.
