Subject: Social Work Resource Plan 2007/08 Mid Year Update

### 1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-
  - ◆ Advise Social Work Resources Committee of progress against the Resource Plan over the first six months of the year.

### 2. Recommendation(s)

- 2.1. The Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):
  - that the progress made to date against the programmes and projects contained within the Resource Plan be noted.

#### 3. Background

- 3.1. The Resource Plan sets out high level objectives and headline priorities to be managed and delivered by the Resource for the period 2007/08. It was approved by Committee at its meeting held on 13 June 2007. The objectives and actions in the Resource Plan have been re-aligned under the new values, objectives and actions of the Council Plan 2007-2011. This allows us to report on progress against the new Council plan's commitments.
- 3.2. The Resource Plan supports the priorities, objectives and values of the new Council Plan 2007-2011. It also reflects the Community Plan objectives.
- 3.3. The Resource Plan links with the priorities being set out at a national and local level as appropriate and provides the context for the development of services in South Lanarkshire.
- 3.4. Full copies of the Resource Plan and respective service/business plans can be made available to members.

#### 4. Objectives for Resource 2007-2008

4.1. The Resource objectives for 2007-2008 are listed below, under the relevant objectives from the new council plan.

#### 5. Progress to Date

- 5.1. Overall, of the 47 actions outlined in our Resource Plan, we have already completed 4 (8%), 36 (77%) are on course and 7 are not on target to deliver within the agreed timescales. Progress on all actions is noted in Appendix 1.
- 5.2. Highlights of the year to date are noted below:
  - Joint Future draft annual evaluation statement for 2006-07 indicates the performance of South Lanarkshire's partners shows "good progress"
  - The number of older people receiving intensive home care is 36% of all people receiving long term care at June 2007 – currently exceeding the annual target of 35%
  - The number of completed assessments for equipment adaptations within 28 days of receipt of referral is 99.68% at June 2007 – currently exceeding the annual target of 95%
  - The number of people whose service starts within 5 working days of their assessment being completed is 77.65% at June 2007 – currently exceeding the target of 71%
  - The number of residential respite care nights provided to people 65+ is 2,452 at June 2007 currently on target for 9,819 within the year
  - Roll out of information and communication technology developments to all new children's houses has been achieved with all children's houses having access to ICT and are connected to the Resource Machines (RM) system and schools
  - Four local action groups have been established in each of the four areas of South Lanarkshire to improve response and services that meet the needs of women, children and young people experiencing domestic abuse.
  - Violent Sex Offenders Register (VISOR) has been established in South Lanarkshire
  - Child protection audit completed and indicated that the majority of the 53 cases sampled demonstrated a positive outcome for children and young people

- The 2006/07 statutory requirements in respect of the 2006/07 financial accounts have been complied with by Social Work Resources. In line with the previously agreed timescale, the audit certificate will be issued by the External Auditors after 30 September 2007
- 3 year plan to improve the management of offenders and reduce offending activity across Lanarkshire – submitted to the Scottish Government on 14 September 2007
- The 2006/07 Internal Audit Plan has been satisfactorily concluded.
  Recommendations have been agreed where required and actions are being progressed. The requirements of the External Auditors have also been complied with by Social Work Resources. The 2007/08 Internal Audit Plan has been approved and is being undertaken. Recommendations are being agreed where required
- 5.3. Actions or measures that we are not currently on course to achieve, by year end, are noted below, together with the reason why, and the management action being taken.
