5 Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 - Application for Variation of a Public Entertainment Licence - Lanark Agricultural Centre

A report dated 3 September 2010 by the Executive Director (Corporate Resources) was submitted on an application for the variation of public entertainment licence No 048 previously granted by the Council under the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.

The applicant had requested that the licence be varied to include poultry and bird exhibitions, and wrestling and boxing events.

In terms of the Act, the opportunity of a hearing had been offered to the applicant who was present and heard in support of the application. An observation from Environmental Services was also considered.

The Committee decided:

that the application by Lawrie and Symington Limited and M MacGregor to vary the terms of public entertainment licence No 048 for Lanark Agricultural Centre to include poultry and bird exhibitions, and wrestling and boxing events be granted.
