## 3. Background

3.1. Based on the theme of '**Challenging socio-economic disadvantage and poverty**,' young people from P6/7 and S1/2 were invited to give a short presentation outlining how they would make this a reality in their school by taking forward a campaign to combat inequality and promote social justice where everyone has opportunity and is included in our society.

# 4. The Competition

- 4.1. There was an encouraging number of entries for the competition and short leeting was carried out by a panel from Education Resources, the Trades Council and the Youth Council.
- 4.2. Of those that entered, five primary and five secondary schools were selected to participate in the final by giving presentations to a group of invited guests in the Council Offices, Hamilton on Monday 24 May 2011.
- 4.3. The judging panel consisted of representatives from the Youth Council, the Trades Council and the Chair of the Equal Opportunities Forum.
- 4.4. The winning teams were Heatheryknowe Primary School, East Kilbride and Trinity High School, Rutherglen.
