Following staff discussions and customer feedback, South Lanarkshire Leisure and Culture are considering the option to change the existing opening hours of the gym facilities at South Lanarkshire Lifestyles Fairhill from 9am to 7am. There is no proposal to review the closing time. The option to open earlier will also provide the opportunity to introduce a new early morning fitness class, should demand be sufficient.

Having the Public Entertainment Licence in place from 7am will allow SLLC to move quickly to implement the change to opening hours, as required, which will increase availability of leisure provision and boost the centres attendances and income through increased fitness memberships. It will also bring the Public Entertainment License in line with the existing Indoor Sports License which is currently applicable from 7am.

The proposal has not been implemented and SLLC remain compliant with the current licence conditions, however SLLC are keen to have the option in place to extend the opening hours of the gym, as and when required.
