1 Declaration of Interests

2 Minutes of Previous Meeting

The minutes of the meeting of the Cambuslang and Rutherglen Area Committee held on 23 August 2011 were submitted for approval as a correct record.

3 Presentation by Strathclyde Fire and Rescue

The Area Commander provided an update on activity in the South Lanarkshire area as a whole and in the Cambuslang and Rutherglen area covering:-

- the opening of the Clydesmill Community Fire Station as a replacement for Cambuslang and Parkhead Fire Stations
- the opening of the Clydesmill Training Centre which would provide training facilities for firefighters across the whole area
- the deployment of new equipment

Reference was also made to the establishment of a single Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and an assurance was provided that the Chief Officer and the Board of Strathclyde Fire and Rescue would ensure that the transition was as smooth as possible.

In addition, the Area Commander presented the 'Strathclyde Fire and Rescue – South Lanarkshire Elected Members' Yearly Update Report for the period 1 April 2010 to 30 June 2011'. The report provided comparisons for the South Lanarkshire area as a whole and on an individual ward basis between the:-

- current Quarter 1 (Q1) results for the period from 1 April to 30 June 2011
- previous 3 years' Q1 average
- previous 3 years' full year average

The Area Commander outlined the information contained in the report and invited feedback from members on the new format and content. Having responded to members' questions, the Area Commander and the Station Commander were thanked for providing their update.

The Committee decided: that the update be noted.

4 HMle Report - Rutherglen High School

A report dated 19 October 2011 by the Executive Director (Education Resources) was submitted on the outcome of the inspection of Rutherglen High School made by Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education (HMIe).

The inspection had taken place in January 2011 as part of a national sample of additional support needs education and the inspection report had been published on 1 March 2011.

A number of particular strengths of the school had been identified in the inspection report. The 4 areas for improvement agreed with the school and education authority had been incorporated into the school's improvement plan and parents would be informed of progress in overtaking the points for action. HMIe had intimated that they would make no further visits in connection with this inspection.

The Quality Improvement Officer and Depute Headteacher spoke on key aspects of the report and responded to members' questions.

The Committee decided: that the report be noted.

5 HMIe Report - St Columbkille's Primary School, Rutherglen

A report dated 14 October 2011 by the Executive Director (Education Resources) was submitted on the outcome of the inspection of St Columbkille's Primary School, Rutherglen made by Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education (HMIe).

The inspection had taken place in February 2011 as part of a national sample of primary education and the inspection report had been published on 26 April 2011.

A number of particular strengths of the school had been indentified in the inspection report. The 3 areas for improvement agreed with the school and education authority had been incorporated into the school's improvement plan and parents would be informed of progress in overtaking the points for action. HMIe had intimated that they would make no further visits in connection with this inspection.

The Quality Improvement Officer and Headteacher spoke on key aspects of the report and responded to members' questions.

The Committee decided: that the report be noted.

6 Roads Investment Programme - Progress Report

A report dated 14 October 2011 by the Executive Director (Enterprise Resources) was submitted on progress with roads investment activity within the Cambuslang and Rutherglen Area Committe area. Details were provided on the:-

- phasing of the additional £126 million expenditure on the Roads Investment Programme from 2008 to 2016
- level of expenditure allocated to each Council area including confirmation that £16.38 million would be spent in Cambuslang and Rutherglen over the 8 year programme
- increased expenditure on footways/footpaths
- priority scoring system for carriageway and footway/footpath schemes
- progress made in relation to the schemes within the Cambuslang and Rutherglen area which showed that 36 schemes had been completed or were programmed to be completed by the end of March 2012
