Subject:	Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 Application by South Lanarkshire Leisure and Culture Limited (formerly known as South Lanarkshire Leisure Limited) and G Campbell to vary the terms of a Public Entertainment Licence for South Lanarkshire Lifestyle, Glenside Drive, Rutherglen
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1 Purpose of Report

1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-

- ♦ consider the application by South Lanarkshire Leisure and Culture Limited (formerly known as South Lanarkshire Leisure Limited) and G Campbell to vary the terms of public entertainment licence No 2 for South Lanarkshire Lifestyle, Glenside Drive, Rutherglen.

2 Recommendation(s)

2.1. The Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):-

- (1) that, the application to vary the terms of Public Entertainment Licence No 2 for South Lanarkshire Lifestyle, Glenside Drive, Rutherglen be granted subject to all recommendations from Building Standards Services being complied with.

3 Background

- 3.1. Before a premises can be operated as a place of public entertainment an application requires to be submitted to the Council for the appropriate licence.
- 3.2. In terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, each application requires to be dealt with on its own individual merits.

4 Present Position

- 4.1. The applicant proposes to alter the layout of the premises at South Lanarkshire Lifestyle, Rutherglen and wishes the maximum number of persons admitted to the premises at any one time to be increased from 700 to 750.
- 4.2. Comments have been received from Building Standards Services.

7 Other Implications

- 7.1. The risk to the Council is that it fails to fulfil its duty to protect the public. This is mitigated by the application process and by holding a hearing to establish all of the background facts relating to the application. - 8.1. There is no requirement to carry out an impact assessment in terms of the proposals contained within this report.
