7 Examination Results (Post Appeal) 2010

A report dated 7 March 2011 by the Executive Director (Education Resources) was submitted on the post appeal examination results for 2010 (Standard Tables and Charts – STACS) which had been released by the Scottish Government.

Information was provided on:-

- the performance of pupils in SQA examinations on a whole authority basis compared with the same information for schools nationally and within South Lanarkshire Council's Family Benchmarking Group
- the performance of girls and boys in examinations
- progression to and performance at Higher level

8 Janitorial Service - Proposal to Extend Pilot Scheme

A joint report dated 11 March 2011 by the Executive Directors (Education Resources), (Community Resources) and (Corporate Resources) was submitted on the proposal to extend the Janitorial Service Pilot Scheme of shared janitorial provision which was delivered by Community Resources on behalf of Education Resources.

Based on the successful Janitorial Service Pilots which had been operating for a number of months, it was now proposed that the Janitorial Service Pilot Scheme be extended to include Chatelherault Primary School sharing with Woodside Primary School and Craigbank Primary School sharing with Robert Smillie Primary School.

The proposed new pilots would run from the end of April/early May 2011 and a period of review would be built in to allow recommendations on adjustments to service delivery to be made if necessary.

Councillor Smith, seconded by Councillor Allison, moved that the recommendations detailed in the report be approved. Councillor S Wardhaugh, seconded by Councillor Maggs, moved as an amendment that the recommendations detailed in the report be not approved on the grounds that there had been no feedback on the existing Janitorial Service Pilots and no consultation had taken place on the proposed Janitorial Service Pilots. On a vote being taken by a show of hands, 6 members voted for the amendment and 15 for the motion which was declared carried.

The Committee decided:

- (1) that the Janitorial Service Pilot Scheme be extended to include Chatelherault Primary School sharing with Woodside Primary School and Craigbank Primary School sharing with Robert Smillie Primary School; and
- (2) that a further report on the outcome of the pilots and any future recommendations on adjustments to service delivery be submitted to a future meeting of this Committee.

9 British Council - Comenius Regio Partnership Projects

A report dated 8 March 2011 by the Executive Director (Education Resources) was submitted on 2 British Council funded Comenius Regio Partnership Projects in which the Council was involved.

The aim of the partnerships was to enhance the European dimension of education by giving educational authorities in different regions the opportunity to work together on one or more topics of mutual interest.

Information was provided on the following 2 projects that the Council had been involved in since 2009:-

- Increasing Literacy Skills in partnership with Ringsaker, Norway
- Creativity to Break Barriers to Achievement in partnership with Madrid, Spain and the University of the West of Scotland

The Committee decided:

- (1) that the positive impact, benefits and opportunity to share good practice that had arisen from the international links established through the British Council funded Comenius Regio Partnership Projects be noted; and
- (2) that Education Resources continue its involvement with this initiative to help establish additional future partnerships.

10 McCormac Review of Teacher Employment in Scotland - 'Call for Evidence'

A report dated 21 March 2011 by the Executive Director (Education Resources) was submitted on the 'Call for Evidence' from the McCormac Committee which had been set up by the Scottish Government to conduct a review of teacher employment in Scotland.

Current salaries and conditions of service for teachers had been established following the publication of 'A Teaching Profession for the 21st Century' in 2001. Following on from the 2010 spending review agreement between the Scottish Government and COSLA which included an agreement to have an independent review of all aspects of the terms and conditions of Scotland's teachers, Professor Gerry McCormac had been asked to chair the review.

Information was provided on the scope of the review together with the specific issues that the 'Call for Evidence', issued on 23 February 2011, was designed to gather views on.

It was proposed that, in view of the timescales involved, the Executive Director (Education Resources), in consultation with the Chair and Depute Chair of the Education Resources Committee, be authorised to agree a response to the 'Call for Evidence' from the McCormac Committee to allow it to be submitted by the closing date of 21 April 2011.

The Committee decided:

- (1) that, in view of the timescales involved, the Executive Director (Education Resources), in consultation with the Chair and Depute Chair of the Education Resources Committee, be authorised to agree a response to the 'Call for Evidence' from the McCormac Committee and submit it by the closing date of 21 April 2011; and
- (2) that a report on the response be submitted to a future meeting of this Committee for noting.

11 Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education (HMIe) - Evaluation of the Educational Psychology Service

A report dated 9 March 2011 by the Executive Director (Education Resources) was submitted on the outcome of Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education's (HMIe) evaluation of the effectiveness of the Educational Psychology Service.

The report highlighted:-

- the key strengths and examples of good practice within the Service
- proposed follow-up action to continue to build on the Service's high performance

HMIe had intimated that, as a result of the Service's high performance and its very good understanding of its strengths and areas for improvement, they would make no further visits in connection with this inspection.

The Educational Psychology Service had also received a COSLA Excellence Award for Best Team for its work in supporting children and families through the 'Give us a Break!' programme. This was further evidence of the Service's commitment to making a difference in improving the life chances of children, young people and families.

It was proposed that arrangements be made to share the excellent practice found in terms of improving the life chances of children and young people, their families and carers through the dissemination of the report 'Educational Psychology in Scotland: Making a Difference'.

The Chair introduced the members of the Educational Psychology Service team and, on behalf of the members of the Committee, praised the work of the team and the outstanding leadership provided by the Psychological Services Manager.

Councillor Watters further praised the achievements of the Educational Psychology Service team on winning the COSLA Excellence Award for Best Team and presented the award to the Psychological Services Manager.

The Committee decided:

- (1) that the positive outcome of the HMIe evaluation of the effectiveness of Educational Psychology Service be noted;
- (2) that the success of South Lanarkshire's Educational Psychology Service in achieving the Best Team award at the 2011 COSLA awards be noted; and
- (3) that arrangements be made to share the excellent practice found in terms of improving the life chances of children, young people and families.
