# 5 Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 - Application for a Private Hire Car Driver's Licence - G Hamill, 19 Bute Avenue, Motherwell

A report dated 2 June 2011 by the Executive Director (Corporate Resources) was submitted on an application for a private hire car driver's licence in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.

In terms of the Act, the opportunity of a hearing had been offered to the applicant who was present and represented by Mr O'Hanlan, Solicitor who was heard in support of his application. An objection had been received from Strathclyde Police and Sergeant Anderson was heard.

Councillor McColl, seconded by Councillor Stewart, moved that the application be refused. Councillor Douglas, seconded by Councillor Docherty, moved as an amendment that the application be granted for a period of 1 year. On a vote being taken by a show of hands, 3 members voted for the motion and 14 for the amendment which was declared carried.

# 6 Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 - Application for a Temporary Public Entertainment Licence by Hamilton Park Racecourse Company Limited and V Kyles

A report dated 2 June 2011 by the Executive Director (Corporate Resources) was submitted on an application for a temporary public entertainment licence in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.

In terms of the Act, the opportunity of a hearing had been offered to the applicant who was present and heard in support of her application.

Observations from Building Standards, Environmental Health, Roads Services and Strathclyde Police were heard.

It was proposed that a formal debrief be arranged following the events on 22 and 23 July 2011 with all parties concerned and that the outcome of the debrief be reported to a future meeting of this Committee.

# 7 Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 - Licensing of Places of Public Entertainment - Suspension of Licence

A report dated 3 June 2011 by the Executive Director (Corporate Resources) was submitted proposing that consideration be given to whether public entertainment licence No 141 should be suspended.

In terms of the Act, the opportunity of a hearing had been offered to the licence holder who was present and represented by J McKissok, Solicitor who was heard in support of the licence holder retaining his licence.

Observations from Environmental Health and Roads Services were heard. Representations were also heard from local residents.

Councillor Douglas, seconded by Councillor Watson, moved that the licence be suspended with immediate effect. Councillor Logan, seconded by Councillor Stewart, moved as an amendment that the licence holder be allowed to continue to trade. On a vote being taken by a show of hands, 5 members voted for the amendment and 9 for the motion which was declared carried.

#### The Committee decided:

that public entertainment licence No 141 be suspended with immediate effect for the unexpired portion of the licence.
