Technical Resources (excl HRA)

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-

 provide information on the progress of the capital programme for Housing and Technical Resources (excl HRA) for the period 1 April 2009 to 19 March 2010.

2. Recommendation(s)

- 2.1. The Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):
 - that the Housing and Technical Resources (excl HRA) capital programme of £7.020million, and expenditure to date of £5.090million be noted.

3. Background

- 3.1. This is the fourth capital monitoring report presented to the Housing and Technical Resources Committee for the financial year 2009/2010.
- 3.2. The report details the financial position for Housing and Technical Resources (excl HRA) on Appendix A.

4. Employee Implications

4.1. None

5. Financial Implications

5.1. The total capital programme for Housing and Technical Resources (excl HRA) for 2009/2010 is £7.020million. Anticipated spend to date was £6.623million, and £5.090million has been spent (72.51% of full budget). This represents a position of £1.533million behind profile. This is mainly due to a timing issue within the Private Housing Scheme of Assistance grants. However, current estimates suggest an outturn for the full year of £6.130million, which is £0.890million less than budget. This is due to an underspend on Procurement of Homeless Accommodation, Lock Up Upgrades and Environmental Improvements. This time last year £5.906million was spent (59.20%).

6. Other Implications

6.1. The main risk associated with the Council's Capital Programme is failure to manage the projects resulting in a significant overspend. The risk has been assessed as low given the detailed project management plans prepared and monitored for each project. The risk of an overspend is managed through 4 weekly Investment Management Meetings.

7. Equality Impact Assessment and Consultation Arrangements

- 7.1. This report does not introduce a new policy, function or strategy or recommend a change to existing policy, function or strategy and therefore no impact assessment is required.
