Subject: Capital Budget Monitoring 2011/2012

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-

- ◆ consolidate the capital budget monitoring to give a Council-wide summary of the 2011/12 Capital Programme. It includes information on the following three capital programmes:
 - General Fund (including Education, Social Work, Roads & Transportation and General Services)
 - Housing
 - Hamilton Ahead
- ◆ advise Committee of the progress on the Capital Programme for the period 1 April 2011 to 10 June 2011.

2. Recommendation(s)

- 2.1. The Committee is asked to approve the following recommendations:
 - that the budget for the General Fund Programme, Housing Programme and Hamilton Ahead for the year 2011/12 as outlined in this report be noted;
 - that the ongoing monitoring and reporting arrangements for all of the Council's Capital Programmes for 2011/12 be noted; and
 - that the position of the General Fund Capital Programme itemised at Appendices 1 and 2, the Housing Capital Programme at Appendix 3 and the Hamilton Ahead Programme at Appendix 4 be noted.

3. Background

- 3.1. Approval for the 2011/12 General Fund Capital Programme was granted at the Executive Committee on 10 February 2011, approving projects totalling £22.261m.
- 3.2. A report was presented to Committee on 26 January 2011 advising of a revised Primary Schools Modernisation Programme. An allocation of £73.410m is required in 2011/12, which includes slippage from 2010/11 of £40.599m.
- 3.3. In relation to the Roads and Rural Investment Plan, the spend profile for the long term programme of works was approved at the Executive Committee on 30 April 2008. An allocation of £12.750m was approved for 2011/12.
- 3.4. Further adjustments to the programme were approved by Committee throughout 2010/11, resulting in net slippage of £20.805m into 2011/12, excluding the Primary Schools Modernisation Programme slippage noted above.

- 3.5. Based on the current 2010/11 year end outturn position, which is provided in a separate report to the Executive Committee, the financial effect of the 2010/11 General Fund outturn is that projects with an estimated spend of £4.576m have been carried forward to the new year 2011/12, in addition to the net slippage of £20.805m noted at 3.4 above.
- 3.6. Finally, taking into account the approved adjustments noted in 3.2 3.4, the revised General Fund programme for 2011/12 is £133.802m.
- 3.7. The revised 2011/12 programme of £133.802m includes allocations for Police Capital Grant (£1.128m) and the Private Housing Scheme of Assistance (£2.034m). However, as this expenditure cannot be classified as capital, approval is sought to monitor both allocations through the 2011/12 Revenue Programme. This is detailed in Note 1 to Appendix 1.

5. Financial Implications

5.1. General Fund

5.1.1. 2011/12 Budget

In the first three months of financial year 2011/12, amendments to the Capital Programme have been proposed by Resources totalling a net decrease of £5.165m. These have been included in this report at Note 1 to Appendix 1. If these proposals are approved, the total capital spending programme for the year will be £128.637m. This is detailed across Resources in Appendix 1.

5.1.2. The programme spend and funding for the General Fund is summarised in Appendix 2. Total funding of £128.637m is available in year.

5.1.3. 2011/12 Monitoring

Budget for the period is £11.219m and spend to the 10 June 2011 is £12.209m (9.49%). This represents spend of £0.990m ahead of profile. This time last year £15.726m was spent, 9.64% of the programme.

Actual funding received to 10 June 2011 is £101.978m (79.28%).

5.2. Housing Programme

5.2.1 2011/12 Budget

The Housing Capital Programme for 2011/12 totals £41.928m and is detailed along with the funding sources at Appendix 3 to this report. This budget was approved by Executive Committee on 10 February 2011.

Programmed funding for the year totals £41.928m.

5.2.2 2011/12 Monitoring

Appendix 3 summarises the position on the Housing programme as at 10 June 2011. Budget for the period is £2.095m and spend to 10 June 2011 amounts to £2.645m (6.3%). This time last year £4.813m was spent (11.88%).

Programmed funding for the year totals £41.928m, as at 10 June 2011 £2.645m had been received.

Regular monitoring of both the General Fund Programme and the Housing Programme is carried out in detail by the Financial Resources Scrutiny Forum and reported on a regular basis to the Executive Committee.

5.3. Hamilton Ahead

5.3.1 2011/12 Budget

The current year programme for Hamilton Ahead is summarised at Appendix 4. The budgeted expenditure for 2011/12 totals £0.170m and was submitted to Executive Committee on 8 June 2011 for approval. This will be funded from capital receipts and additional external income anticipated.

5.3.2 2011/12 Monitoring

The budgeted expenditure for 2011/12 totals £0.170m with £0.031m being spent by 10 June 2011.

Programmed funding for the year totals £0.170m, as at 10 June 2011 £0.053m had been received.

6. Other Implications

6.1. The main risk associated with the Council's Capital Programme is that there is a significant overspend. The risk has been assessed as low given the detailed project management plans prepared and monitored for each project. The risk of overspend is managed through four weekly Investment management meetings.

7. Equality Impact Assessment and Consultation Arrangements

- 7.1 This report does not introduce a new policy, function or strategy or recommend a change to existing policy, function or strategy and therefore no impact assessment is required.
- 7.2. There was also no requirement to undertake any consultation in terms of the information contained in this report.

Approval is sought to increase the 2011/12 Capital Programme by £1.050m to reflect this additional income.

Rural Investment Plan

Approval is sought to allow slippage of £0.257m from the 2011/12 allocation for (£0.257m) the Rural Investment Plan as the current programme of works will be completed over a two year period.

Clyde Gateway

Approval is sought to allow slippage of £0.511m from the 2011/12 allocation for (£0.511m) Clyde Gateway as the current programme of works will be completed over a two year period.

Rural Business Space

Additional ERDF funding of £0.195m has been secured to contribute towards £0.195m works at Lindsaylands Road, Biggar. Approval is sought to increase the 2011/12 Capital Programme to reflect this.

Roads and Transportation Refurbishment

In order to carry out a variety of projects including bridge strengthening works, upgrading of parapets and traffic signal upgrades, funding of £0.515m is (£0.515m) required. It is proposed that this be funded from the 2011/12 allocation for the Roads Investment Plan.

Hamilton International Technology Park

Expenditure of £1.575m is anticipated in 2011/12 in relation to road £1.575m improvements associated with the Hamilton International Technology Park. It is proposed that this be funded as follows:

This will result in a net increase of £1.000m to the 2011/12 Capital Programme.

Finance and IT Resources

IT Network Development and Communications

Approval is sought to increase the 2011/12 Capital Programme by £0.150m to enable investment in the corporate network. This will include the replacement / upgrade of key networking systems that are at or near end of manufacturer support. This will be funded by a contribution from the IT Development Fund.

Caird Data Centre

Initial investigatory works are required to provide estimated costs for the replacement of air conditioning units in phases 1 and 2 of the Caird Data Centre. Approval is sought to increase the 2011/12 Capital Programme by £0.050m to allow the initial survey works to be undertaken. This will be funded by a contribution from the IT Development Fund.

Housing and Technical Resources

Private Housing Scheme of Assistance

A review of the 2011/12 budget requirements for the Private Housing Scheme of Assistance programme has been undertaken which has identified a saving of £0.873m. Housing and Technical Resources have proposed that £0.676m be reinvested in a number of upgrading projects within council properties, including the following:

It is proposed that the remaining balance be recognised as a saving to the programme.

Private Housing Scheme of Assistance

As expenditure in relation to the Private Housing Scheme of Assistance cannot be classified as capital, approval is sought to monitor the remaining allocation as part of the 2011/12 Housing and Technical Resources Revenue Programme.

Office Accommodation

Following a revised programme of works being identified in relation to the HQ Major Maintenance Upgrade, approval is sought to allow slippage of £1.213m from the 2011/12 Capital Programme. This is due to the re-phasing of various works including drainage, steam distribution and works to the main switchboard.

Planned office refurbishment works are unlikely to commence this financial year. Approval is sought to allow slippage of £0.300m from the 2011/12 Capital Programme which will enable these works to be completed next financial year.

HQ Voltage Optimiser

As a consequence of the revised programme of works identified in relation to the HQ Major Maintenance Upgrade, this project is unlikely to commence until 2012/13. Approval is sought to allow slippage of £0.275m from the 2011/12 Capital Programme to enable these works to be completed next financial year.

Sundry Debtors System Replacement

Approval is sought to allow slippage of £0.335m from the 2011/12 Capital Programme as works are unlikely to commence this financial year.

Larkhall Housing Office

In a separate report to this Committee, Housing and Technical Resources have advised of proposals to upgrade Larkhall Housing Office to provide accommodation for a local Integrated Facility. In order for the works to progress, the following contributions are required:

Approval is sought to transfer £0.023m from the Community Resources 2011/12 Capital Programme (from the Upgrades to Community Infrastructure programme) and £0.250m from the Enterprise Resources 2011/12 Capital Programme (from the Town and Village Centres – Larkhall and Peacock Cross projects) to enable the works to be undertaken.

Social Work Resources

David Walker House

It is unlikely that the full allocation awarded for IT costs will be required for this project. Approval is sought to reduce the budget for David Walker House by £0.100m, with £0.050m being recognised as a saving to the programme and the remaining £0.050m being used for the purchase of furniture and equipment for other Homes for the Elderly throughout South Lanarkshire.
