Application for Variation of Street Trader's Licence – B

Allison, 64 Glencairn Drive, Coatbridge

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-

♦ consider the application by B Allison, 64 Glencairn Drive, Coatbridge for the variation of street trader's licence No 020 in the East Kilbride zone.

2. Recommendation(s)

- 2.1. The Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):
 - that the application by B Allison, 64 Glencairn Drive, Coatbridge for the variation of street trader's licence No 020 in the East Kilbride zone be granted

3. Background

- 3.1. Before a person can operate as a street trader, they require to apply to the Council for the appropriate street trader's licence.
- 3.2 In terms of the legislation "street trading" means doing any of the following things in a public place:
 - a) hawking, selling or offering or exposing for sale any article;
 - b) offering to carry out or carrying out for money or money's worth any service to any person in a public place.
- 3.3. In terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, each application requires to be dealt with on its own merits.

4. Present Position

- 4.1. An application has been received from B Allison, 64 Glencairn Drive, Coatbridge to vary the terms of street trader's licence No 20. The applicant has requested that she be allowed to trade from the vehicle licensed by S Hutton, street trader's licence No 02, for Peel Park, College Milton South to provide emergency cover only, such as, hospital appointments and sick leave.
- 4.2. No adverse comments have been received from consultees.
