1 Declaration of Interests

2 Minutes of Previous Meeting

3 Minutes of Special Meeting

4 Scottish Fire and Rescue Service

R Lennox, East Kilbride Community Fire Station, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service (SFRS) gave an update in respect of activity within the East Kilbride area and how this activity measured against agreed targets for the period 2020/2021.

The presentation provided performance information covering the period 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021, with a comparison against the same period from the previous year. Information was provided on:-

- deliberate primary fires
- deliberate secondary fires
- accidental dwelling fires
- accidental 'other' building fires
- fatal fire casualties
- non-fatal fire casualties (excluding precautionary check-up)
- special service (road traffic collisions)
- special service (fatal and non-fatal casualties)
- ♦ false alarms (malicious false alarms and unwanted fire alarm signals (non-domestic))

R Lennox, having responded to members' questions, was thanked for his informative presentation.

The Committee decided: that the presentation be noted.

5 Playscheme Grant Applications

A report dated 4 May 2021 by the Executive Director (Finance and Corporate Resources) was submitted on applications for playscheme grant for 2021/2022.

Playscheme funding allowed an allocation of £600 to be made to playschemes that operated over the summer, October and Easter holiday periods with £400 for the summer period only and £100 for each of the October and Easter periods. Application forms had been recently submitted and were still subject to review in terms of meeting the Council's criteria for receipt of funding. It was, therefore, proposed that grant awards be agreed, in principle, subject to the satisfactory review process.

Financial provision was available for individual playschemes to receive, as appropriate, Travel and Freedom Passes from Strathclyde Partnership for Transport.
