Planning Objection  
Westsidewood Farm Application no CL/09/0483

The following objections are lodged against the proposal by Mr & Mrs Fraser Dunlop for the construction of a house on land at Westsidewood Farm.

Public services in this area of South Lanarkshire are totally inadequate to support any additional housing. The road network is deteriorating at such a rate that the minimum maintenance regime adopted by South Lanarkshire Council is totally inadequate to keep pace with the gradual disintegration of the road surface.

Electricity supplies are very prone to disruption due to storm damage and falling trees, and water supply is equally susceptible to pressure failure and cuts. This area is not served by mains gas and television coverage is also unreliable. I have heard that there is no guarantee that the proposed digital transmission will improve signal quality. The siting of the proposed house within the existing trees will mean that television reception for the proposed house will be even worse.

Until such times as the Council can improve the roads, power supply, water and television reception, no further development should be allowed in this area.

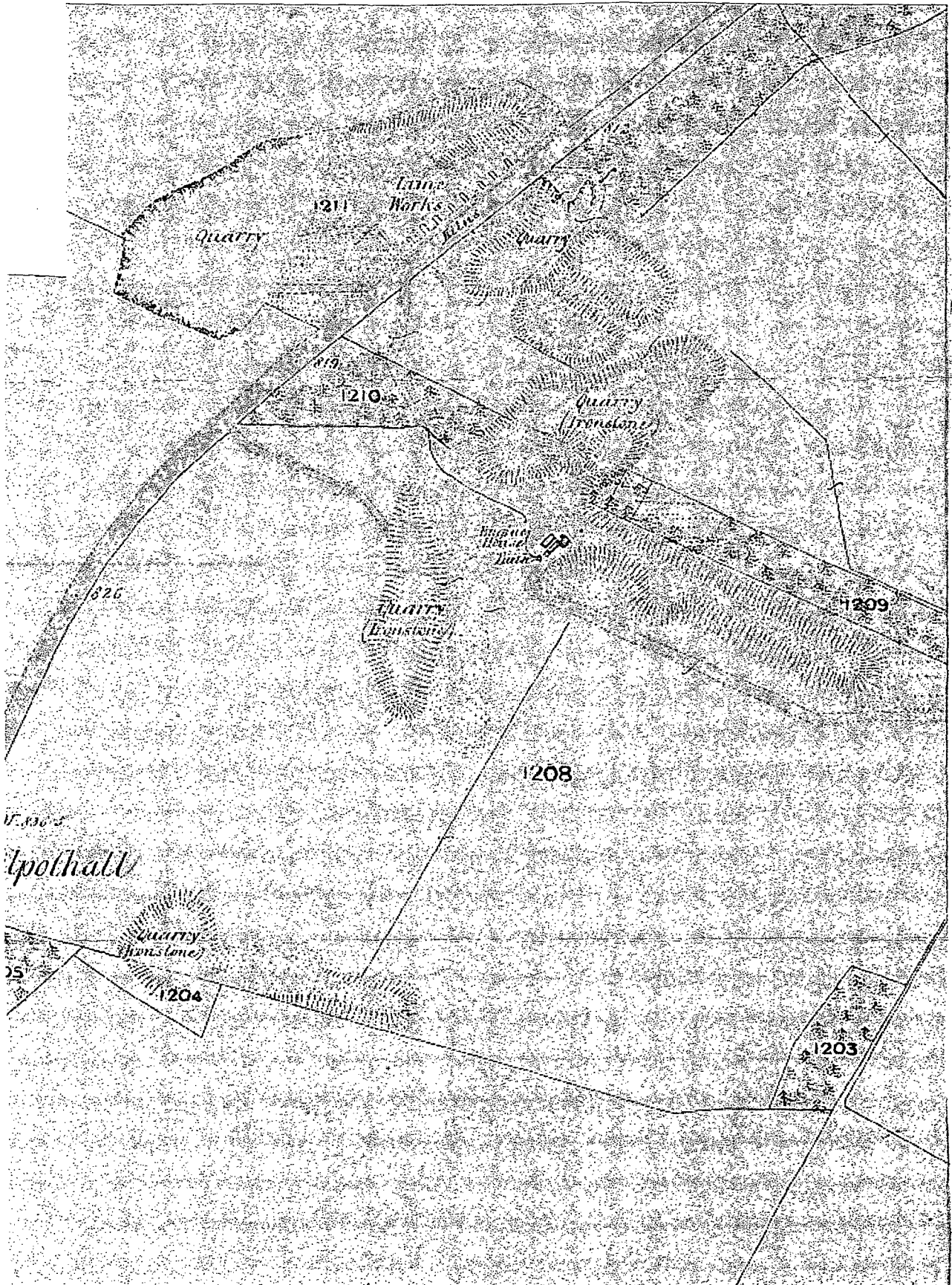

I wish to record my objection against the proposal by Fraser Dunlop for the construction of a house on land at Westside Wood Farm, Carnwath.


