1. Purpose of Report

1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-

- ◆ advise on action taken, by the Chair of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project Implementation Group in terms of the Scheme of Delegation, to introduce 1 further Council and Strathclyde Fire and Rescue to the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project as Associate Members

2. Recommendation(s)

2.1. The Joint Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):-

- (1) that, in view of the exceptional circumstances as set out in the report below, the action taken by the Chair of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project Implementation Steering Group in consultation with the Convener, in accepting Highland Council, and Strathclyde Fire and Rescue as Associate Members of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project, be noted.

3. Background

- 3.1. The terms of the grant provided to the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project by the National Board for Shared Services include the condition that the outcomes of the Project are made available to all other local authorities in Scotland.
- 3.2. The Clyde Valley Learning and Development Joint Committee's Minute of Agreement (approved on 1 September 2008) includes the provision that other local authorities or similar bodies may become Associate Members by agreement of the Joint Committee (clause 3.8). Associate Members may be permitted by the Joint Committee to utilise some or all of the services of the Project but will have no right to vote on the Joint Committee.
- 3.3. In June 2010, Edinburgh City Council, Falkirk Council and the Scottish Local Government Improvement Service became Associate Members of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Group. This brought the number of Associate Members to 7.

4. Current Position

- 4.1. The work of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Group continues to be of much interest to other local authorities and public sector bodies with similar interests. This has been largely attributed to the continuing interest in the development of

Shared Services throughout the public sector. In particular, several councils have made enquiries in relation to the Clyde Valley Group's successful procurement of e-learning services for its Member and Associate Member Councils.

- 4.2 The Scottish Local Government Improvement Service continues to support and promote this aspect of the Project, and is keen that as many councils as possible should benefit from having access to the e-learning management system and associated modules which the Clyde Valley has procured with subsequent benefits of greater economies of scale in content development and delivery.
- 4.3 As a result, representatives from Highland Council have requested that their organisation be considered for Associate Membership.
- 4.4 Strathclyde Fire and Rescue has also requested that it be granted Associate Member status, and has stated that the work being carried out through the Clyde Valley Project is consistent with many of their key priorities for learning and development. Representatives from Strathclyde Fire and Rescue have also expressed an interest in contributing their expertise to the Project where possible.
- 4.5 The Scheme of Delegation makes provision for the Chair of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Implementation Group to take action in exceptional circumstances and report to the Joint Committee as soon as is practicable, subject to consulting with the Convener.
- 4.6 In view of the fact that both organisations were keen to be involved at the earliest possible stage, and where appropriate gain access to the Clyde Valley e-Learning contract, the Chair of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project Implementation Steering Group, in consultation with the Convener, granted Associate Membership under the Scheme of Delegation to the 2 organisations.
- 4.7 It remains a condition of the original funding grant that outcomes and learning from the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project should be shared nationally. By extending associate membership to these 2 organisations, it demonstrates the Group's continuing commitment to this principle.

6. Financial Implications

- 6.1. The discount structure applied to the procurement of e-learning services is based on a sliding scale. The higher the number of councils and organisations participating in the procurement, the greater the discount shared across the Clyde Valley Members and Associate Members. Associate Members do not benefit directly from the original funding grant but indirectly through negotiated discounts for those services which Associate Member Councils purchase.
- 6.2 The Clyde Valley e-Learning contract provides for a further discount of 2.5% should 14 councils sign up to the deal. The contract is reviewed annually and the number of councils signed up at this point in time dictates the discount for the coming year. 13 councils had bought into the contract, as at 1 August 2010, therefore the discount that will apply to all for year 2 of the contract will be 25%.

7. Other Implications

- 7.1. The risks of membership are limited and identified in the Minute of Agreement.

8. Equality Impact Assessment and Consultation Arrangements

- 8.1. This report does not introduce a new policy, function or strategy or recommend a change to an existing policy, function or strategy and therefore no impact assessment is required.
- 8.2. The admission of additional Associate Members has been discussed and agreed by the Implementation Steering Group and approved by the Chair of the Implementation Steering Group under delegated authority.
