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| Subject: | Social Work Resources - Capital Budget Monitoring 2017/2018 |
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1. Purpose of Report

1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-

- ◆ provide information on the progress of the capital programme for Social Work Resources for the period 1 April 2017 to 21 July 2017.

2. Recommendation(s)

2.1. The Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):-

- (1) that the Social Work Resources' capital programme of £0.405million, and expenditure to date of £0.028 million, be noted.

3. Background

3.1. This is the first capital monitoring report presented to the Social Work Resources Committee for the financial year 2017/2018. Further reports will follow throughout the year.

3.2. The budget reflects the approved programme for the year (As approved at Council meeting, 16 February 2017), exceptions approved during 2016/2017 and monies carried forward for projects from 2016/2017. It also includes budget adjustments approved by the Executive Committee during 2017/2018 up to and including its meeting on 30 August 2017.

3.3. The report details the financial position for Social Work Resources in Appendix A.

5. Financial Implications

5.1. The total capital programme for Social Work Resources for 2017/2018 is £0.405million. Anticipated spend to date was £0.021million, and £0.028million has been spent (6.91% of full budget). This represents a position of £0.007million ahead of profile.

6. Other Implications

- 6.1. The main risk associated with the Council's Capital Programme is that there is an overspend. The risk has been assessed as low given the detailed project management plans prepared and monitored for each project. The risk of overspend is managed through four weekly Investment Management Meetings.
- 6.2. There are no implications for sustainability in terms of the information contained in this report.

- 7.1. This report does not introduce a new policy, function or strategy or recommend a change to an existing policy, function or strategy and, therefore, no impact assessment is required.
