## 1. Purpose of Report

1.1. The purpose of the report is to:-

 advise on action taken by the Chair of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project Implementation Group, in terms of the Scheme of Delegation, to introduce a further 2 Councils and the Scottish Local Authority Improvement Service to the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project as Associate Members

## 2. Recommendation(s)

- 2.1. The Joint Committee is asked to approve the following recommendation(s):
  - that, in view of the exceptional circumstances as set out in the report below, the action taken by the Chair of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project Implementation Group in consultation with the Convenor, in accepting Edinburgh City Council, Falkirk Council and the Scottish Local Authority Improvement Service as Associate Members of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project, be noted.

## 3. Background

- 3.1. The terms of the grant provided to the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project by the National Board for Shared Services include the condition that the outcomes of the Project are made available to all other local authorities in Scotland.
- 3.2. The Clyde Valley Learning and Development Joint Committee's Minute of Agreement (approved on 1 September 2008) includes the provision that other local authorities or similar bodies may become Associate Members by agreement of the Joint Committee (clause 3.8). Associate Members may be permitted by the Joint Committee to utilise some or all of the services of the Project but will have no right to vote on the Joint Committee.
- 3.3 In March 2010, Aberdeen City and Midlothian Councils became Associate Members of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Group. This brought the number of Associate Members to 4.

## 4. Current Position

4.1 The work of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Group continues to be of much interest to other local authorities and public sector bodies with similar interests.

This has been largely attributed to the continuing interest in the development of Shared Services throughout the public sector. In particular, several councils have made enquiries in relation to the Clyde Valley Group's successful procurement of elearning services for its Member and Associate Member Councils.

- 4.2 The Scottish Local Government Improvement Service continues to support and promote this aspect of the Project, and is keen that as many councils as possible should benefit from having access to the e-learning management system and associated modules which the Clyde Valley has procured with subsequent benefits of greater economies of scale in content development and delivery.
- 4.3 As a result, representatives from Edinburgh City Council and Falkirk Council have requested that their organisations be considered for Associate Membership. This is primarily driven by recognition of the benefits associated with the work currently being addressed by the E-Learning Sub Group.
- 4.4 The Scottish Local Authority Improvement Service has also requested that it be granted Associate Member status, as an illustration that it endorses the Clyde Valley Group's strategy and approach to e-learning. Becoming an Associate member of the Group also allows the Improvement Service to purchase the Brightwave technology and thereby support the development of content for the platform and allow councils to access the 360° appraisal module for Elected Members.
- 4.5 The Scheme of Delegation makes provision for the Chair of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project Implementation Steering Group to take measures in exceptional circumstances and report to the Joint Committee as soon as is practicable, subject to advising the Convenor.
- 4.6 In view of the fact that all 3 organisations were keen to be involved at an early stage of the contract and to make their budgetary commitments at the beginning of the financial year, the Chair of the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project Implementation Steering Group, in consultation with the Convenor, granted associate membership under the Scheme of Delegation.
- 4.7 It remains a condition of the original funding grant that outcomes and learning from the Clyde Valley Learning and Development Project should be shared nationally. By extending associate membership to these 3 organisations, it demonstrates the Group's commitment to this principle.

## 6. Financial Implications

6.1. The discount structure applied to the procurement of e-learning services is based on a sliding scale. The higher the number of councils participating in the procurement, the greater the discount shared across the Clyde Valley Members and Associate Members. Associate Members do not benefit directly from the original funding grant but indirectly through negotiated discounts for those services which Associate Member Councils purchase.
