My comments on the proposed planning application, and subsequent objection are as follows.

Carnwath Road and Craighill Road are already heavily used by both private and agricultural vehicles. Any construction work will increase the noise and disturbance to this rural area.

Our School buses use these roads, and there is a childrens playpark here. Construction vehicles would cause concern for road safety.

The burn/waterway at the back of houses 10/12/14 and 16 has flooded on many occasions. This waterway is attached to the applicants land.
The water there is foul smelling and when flooding has caused a problems with rats invading the back gardens. This will only be exacerbated, during construction work.

There will be a severe loss of privacy for our homes.

There are plots of land available at the bottom of Craighill Road, that are already set up with drainage and electricity.
Myself and my neighbours do not understand why one of these could not be purchased by the applicant, rather than block our homes in, with a new development.
